

TRANSFER ADMISSIONS GUARANTEE (TAG) AGREEMENT

Between
Dillard University
and
San Diego City College

Dillard University and San Diego City College (herein referred to as SDCC) enter into the following agreement governing the matriculation at Dillard University beginning Fall Semester 2012 and continuing until either party decides to dissolve the agreement.

During the period of this agreement, Dillard University will:

1. Accept SDCC students who have completed a minimum of 24 transferable semester units with an overall 2.2 or higher grade point average.
 - a. Only courses in which a grade of "C" or better was earned will be accepted. Students must be in good standing at their previous institutions.
 - b. SDCC students must have completed the program of courses that are deemed to be equivalent to Dillard University courses based on the Intersegment General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) used by California Community College students to prepare to transfer to the University of California and California State University systems.
 - c. SDCC students understand that he/she may need to complete additional prerequisites as required by the Dillard University programs in which he/she enrolls.
 - d. Dillard University will not accept more than sixty semester hours (units) of transfer credit.
2. Provide priority consideration for scholarships if the SDCC student's grade point average is a 3.0 or higher.
3. Provide priority consideration for on-campus housing if enrollment fees are paid by the application deadline.
4. Waive the application fee.

During the period of this agreement, SDCC will:


1. Publicize the agreement among its students and faculty and identify potential students who would benefit from this transfer agreement;
2. Make available to prospective transfer students, through early advisement sessions, information and requirements for admission to Dillard University.

Both Dillard University and SDCC will:


1. Monitor the academic performance of students enrolling under this agreement, identify problems, and work cooperatively to facilitate the seamless transfer of students between Dillard University and SDCC and
2. Notify each other of any curricular changes relevant to this agreement in a timely manner.

1. Complete a minimum of 24 transferable semester units as outlined on the Dillard Transfer Guide with an overall 2.2 or higher grade point average on a 4.0 scale or complete the Intersegment General Education Transfer Curriculum (IGETC) guide.
2. Submit a complete Dillard University application by the posted deadline found on the web site at www.Dillard.edu.
3. Submit official transcripts from all colleges attended for verification of eligibility for the term indicated.

CONDITIONS TO SIGN A (DILLARD UNIVERSITY) TAG AGREEMENT

- The TAG deadline for the fall semester is April 30th (fall Dillard application deadline is May 30th) and the TAG deadline for the spring semester is October 31st (spring Dillard application deadline is November 30th).
- TAG agreements may be made for Dillard University only after the student has completed six transferable units and completed or are currently enrolled in a transferable Math class or one level below transferable Math (example Math 96) and completed or are currently enrolled in transferable English or are currently in one level below college level English (example English 48 and 49).
- To enter into a TAG agreement make a counseling appointment at the counseling front counter or contact the Counseling Office at (619) 388-3540 and be sure to mention that you would like to enter into a HBCU TAG agreement.
- Please note that students may need to complete additional prerequisites as required by the programs which he/she enrolls at Dillard University.

This agreement is valid only for the term checked above. If a later term of entry is desired, a new TAG must be completed.
