Requirements for a Major in Criminal Justice



The Major of Criminal Justice is awarded upon completion of:

- The 41 hours university General Education core curriculum
- A minimum of 30 hours of coursework in the major
- Cognate (related) support courses
- General Electives
- The community service/service learning requirement
- The writing proficiency examination (ENG 199)

- Students must earn "C" or better in all major courses
- Majors must have complete or be enrolled simultaneously in SOC 101 to enroll in CJ 205
- Introduction to Criminal Justice is the prerequisite for all other criminal justice courses
