

South African human rights activist and politician Helen Suzman is being honored this month at an exhibit in Dillard University's Will W. Alexander Library. The exhibit, which runs from Jan. 9 to Feb. 1, will culminate with the dedication of the American-Jewish Committee Distance Learning Conference Room on Sunday, Jan. 31 at 3 p.m.
